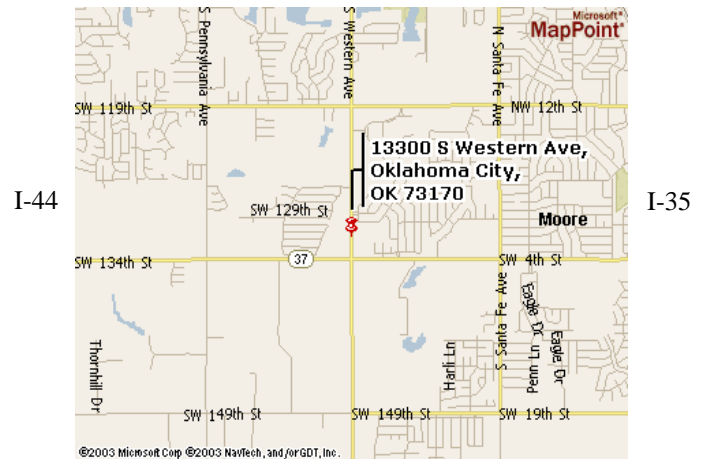

You have got to Get over your Self, if you want to get past your problems!



II Corinthians 10: 3-6 – *For we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh, for the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh, but divinely powerful for the destruction of fortresses. We are destroying speculations and every lofty thing raised up against the knowledge of God, and we are taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ, and we are ready to punish all disobedience, whenever your obedience is complete.*

Since all of us were raised under this world's carnal influence we have equated our self identity with how we feel. That is the first mistake in the deception about our self. And that is another story. But since this is true for many of us, we have to get over our feelings controlling us before we can get past our problems.

I can hear someone say it now, "what is wrong with my feelings?" What is wrong with your feelings is that they control you. But God did not intend for that to be the case. In fact, if you feelings control you will never get over, you will never get beyond your problems.

Like so many others issues in life, the deceiver has led humankind around by the nose through some extreme abuse of God's order. In the past some people were taught us to ignore their feelings, to suppress them, to deny them. But that was not God's order. Now many of us have lived by the other extreme. We are told to express them, to embrace them, honor them above all else. We say we are speaking our mind. We say we are speaking the truth. But really, we are speaking our feelings.

There is nothing wrong in identifying our feelings. In fact, we did not to do so in order we do not deceive ourselves. But the problem with speaking our feelings is that we stop there. We let our feelings be the last word. And if our feelings are our last word we are denying God's word and living out a carnal life of self centeredness. And this leads to wrong decisions, which can lead to self-destruction. It reminds me of the scripture that says, "There is a way which seems right unto man, but the end thereof is destruction."

The three things which stand in your way of you receiving God's best for you is ignorance of the truth, error about the truth and self centered emotions. The problem with these emotions is that it chances your focus from God to self. And this will lead you away from the knowing the truth. That is, the truth that will set you free and keep you clean.

Identify your feeling, if you need. But acknowledge God by submitting them to Him, and allow God to correct and align them. This brings them into the right order in your life so they won't rule over you. If you do not, they will lead you

astray. And your personal victory will be spoiled. Your testimony will be weakened. And your hope cast down.

The right place of order for emotions is under God, under your will to choose to do right and over your control to temper and discipline for the glory of God. Your emotions are a gift from God. But any gift out of order or exalted above their place can be a curse used by Satan against you and others in the Body of Christ. Choose life rather than death.

Dear SGMM Family,

I want to share with my Son-Grace family what God has been doing in my life these last few months and let you know how much I've appreciated your prayers concerning my job change.

Last June I found out I was going to lose my job. It was funded by a grant, and rather than pick up my salary, my employer decided to let me go and change my job to an entry level position for a much lower salary. I was devastated, angry, and hurt. I had no idea how the income and benefits from that job would be replaced. Being in that frame of mind I couldn't see what God was about to do.

I looked into several possibilities as for another job. My main goal was to work in Chickasha so I could be close to the girls in case they needed me during the day. Another option was for me to go back to work in Oklahoma City at the FAA where I worked before the girls were born. I had been in contact with my former boss, and she told me a position might open up and I could return. I wasn't thrilled with that idea because it was 40 miles away from home, so I would be working a full day plus taking the time to commute back and forth.

None of the jobs I pursued in Chickasha worked out, and going to work in Oklahoma City seemed more and more likely. I struggled with the idea of having to work far away from home and find after-school care for the girls. But God, in His infinite wisdom and mercy, put me to work at the FAA in Oklahoma City.

As it turns out, that was the best thing that could have happened. I'm allowed to have a flexible work schedule so I can go to work early in the morning and get back to Chickasha in time to pick up the girls from school. An added bonus has been that Mike has to take the girls to school and gets to spend that extra time in the mornings with them.

I treasure the prayers of my Son-Grace family who have been so faithful and caring, and I want all of you to know how much I love you. God Bless You!

Ps 103:1 Bless the Lord, O my soul: and all that is within me, bless his holy name. 2.
