Communion with the Most High

I am amazed how little those of us who are apart of the Body of Christ seem to spend time in Communion with God. We find ourselves so busy and when there is time we are tired or have other things we want to do instead of communing with God.

Whether you call it fellowship, communion or prayer, the fact remains you will not be able to maintain your faith, let alone your calling without regularly relating to God.

God has even given us Himself in the form of the Holy Spirit so we could live in union with Him in a way no Old Testament person could experience. He is our companion, our lover and our teacher, our comforter and our guide. Yet we deny His right, His presence, and His power in our lives.

Communion means, to be as one with another. Yet, in practice we don't usually live like He exists, let alone, like He lives in us. Our life is His. Our bodies are temples of His presence. But like the many Bibles we may own, we sit Him aside as an idol to attend to when things get scary or we began to feel helpless.

The Song of Solomon is the perfect picture of the love and attention God wants to have with us, an intimacy even beyond a lover of this earth. Yet like a long married spouse, we invest little communion with the lover of our soul.

I need to warn you, times are upon us that will not be tolerable without relating with our savior, or sustainer, our rock and provider and taking refuge in Him. It is sad that the world must become so bad that we are driven to our knees in prayer just to fellowship with Him. I don't know about you, but I am not content with my communion with this living Spirit, this God of glory, this lover of my soul. God longs to have your attention, your trust, your investment in His relationship with you. He waits upon your use of free will to honor Him and take your pleasure in Him.

What are you waiting for? Life is not fulfilling without the completion you need and can only find in His presence, his love and His Words of life. But, if you don't already know this, know that this communion will not happen automatically in life just because you are saved and say you believe in Jesus. You must desire His presence. You must make Him first place in your life. You must choose to invest in this relationship. And it goes far beyond church, ministry, deeds of kindness or gifts of mercy to others. These activities will be a fruit of

your relationship with Him when you make Him first in your love attention. These activities will not be burdensome when you turn yourself over, and again to the love of your life. But these deeds are not the same as your relationship with the Most High in your life.

Some may say the Song of Solomon is not appropriate to describe God relationship with us. But I believe the physical love of man and women describes only minimally the love and intimacy God has desired with you. Humankind has perverted physical love to the point it no longer clearly reflects a symbol of God's desire for our intimacy and oneness. God wants to commune with you, His redeemed. But He will not force upon you intimacy you are not willing to enter into.

He is our creator. He is our redeemer. He is our lover and friend. Invest seeds of communion and allow Him to come into your most intimate self. He longs to relate to you and share Himself with you. He longs to with one with you in the highest of ways, ways of the Spirit.

Dear Faithful Friends and Partners,

What a wild ride it has been around here this spring (tornado season here in Oklahoma). In all the 40 years that I have been living in this state, I have never personally seen a tornado. I think I may have seen one wrapped in rain once. All I could see was a mass of moving cloud-to-ground blackness.

I have to say that this spring was the closest I have ever been to thinking that I might actually experience a direct hit. My children and I were huddled in a hallway covered with blankets and pillow. The portable TV had our trusted weatherman telling us where the storm chasers were seeing power flashes. Now that means that electrical lines are breaking and is the way to see the effects of tornadic activity in a populated area after the sun goes down. Well, those lines going down were the lines that feed my neighborhood with the power station being at the entrance to my neighborhood. Let's just say if a tornado had been totally on the ground, my house would have been very close to it.

A neighborhood about three miles from me had some damage, with no serious injuries. It is very strange to have enough time in a dangerous situation to actually think about what is happening. I had enough time to know that I had no control over what

was about to happen or not happen to my children and me. Never have I been so aware of absolutely being reliant on prayer. Yet I was pretty calm. In those moments, I was at peace with whatever happened.

Those of us in the Central Plains may experience tornadoes from time to time, but there is so much that we face as a nation right now. In many ways, we are in as much danger as the people who did experience a tornado. We are all facing soaring gas and food prices. Many of us are not able to grasp how God could be in favor of the likely outcome of the upcoming presidential election. This could be a very scary, threatening time for all of us. Except for one major factor- our hope in our God.

The danger is not in the eventual price of gas and food, but in us not being at peace in the midst of it. The danger is in losing our hope in the stress of the situations of life. The danger is in becoming angry and pulling away from faithfulness to God. That is more frightening to me than any natural disaster or threat of national recession.

Be found faithful, full of hope, and in peace, dear friends, in this troubling time. Hope is not wishful thinking. It is calm assurance in the promises of our God. He is faithful; therefore, we can be faithful.
