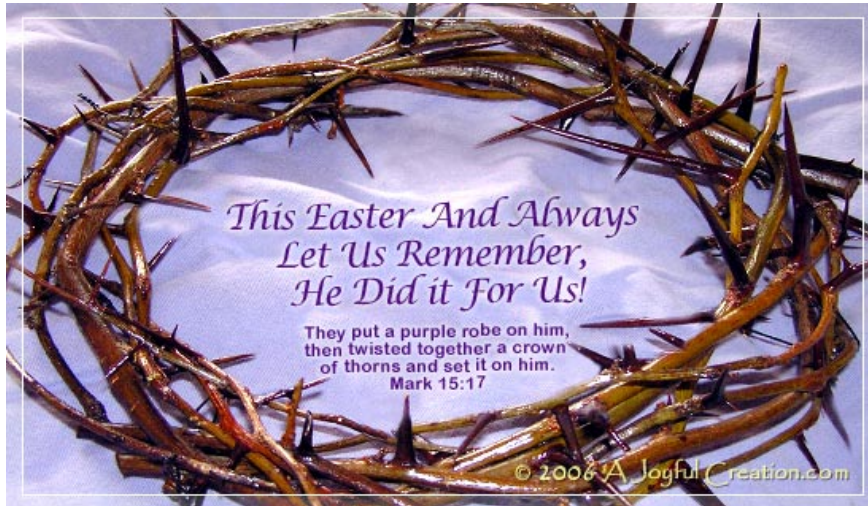

Worship?

I recently heard an actor playing the part of a sick, but successful athlete on a TV show say that he received a letter containing the worship of some young man. The actor, seemed troubled about this and said, he had looked up the meaning of "worship". He said, it meant to love and honor someone without any other reason except that that someone was worthy of it (worship). Meaning that worship involves the unconditional love, honor and devotion of someone without any strings attached. This definition means that worship does not depend upon happiness of the worshipper or the blessedness of the worshiper nor the expectations of the worshipper. Worship means the love, honor and devotion of someone who is worthy because of who they are, not want they do.

Now, as Christians, we know that only God is worthy of worship. And that God is more worthy than us in all ways. He is trust worthy. He is worthy by character. He is worthy by nature. He is worthy by knowledge. He is worthy by power. He is worthy by revelation. He is worthy by His eternal existence. He is worthy for so many reasons. But does not the same definition apply? Or is your worship based upon your circumstances, your mood, or your expectations of God being meant? Does not God deserve our worship all the time, in all seasons, for all reasons?

I used to find fault with those of certain theological slants who implied that since God was sovereign, we should praise him and thank him in any situation. My problem with those who communicated this theology was that they seemed to think God's sovereignty meant that he caused all things to happen that had happened. They did not seem to credit the responsibility of humans, let alone the intent and presence of evil in this world for anything happening. Now, I still do not believe that God is responsible for everything that happens. But I am becoming more convinced that He is worthy of our worship all the time, in every situation, in the midst of any struggle or injustice or calamity, no matter the source or fault of the situation.

I have been guilty of worshipping God when He met my expectations, when He seemed worthy, when I was not hurting, disappointed, or disillusioned or angry about someone I could not seem to control. But I have not been guilty of worshipping Him all the time, in every situation, at every opportunity. If worship of God means love and devotion, praise and thanksgiving, surely it means God is worthy always. He is worthy of my attention, my devotion, my thanksgiving, my praise, all the day, in every way. Anything less is not worshipping Him unconditionally, but only based on what He has done or is doing or has promised to do for me. That would be self-serving worship, manipulating worship, hypocritical worship. That would not be agape love, let alone honor and devotion to one worthy of worship as God.

John 4:23 But the hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship him. KJV

My question is, what are the reasons we worship God? And is it true worship? That is, is it in spirit and in truth? Since God is sovereign, since God is both our creator and redeemer, surely He is worthy of our adoration at all times. But not because we are happy, blessed or even satisfied at any one given moment. Since He is God, He is worthy of our worship because He is, because He is more worthy than we, because He alone is self-sufficient and wholly holy and fully righteous. He is worthy because He chose to reveal Himself to us and share His love with us.

He is worthy of our praise, our thanksgiving, our devotion, our love in return.

Dear Filese and everyone at SGMM;

Greetings and blessings to you! I am so excited about the way our Lord moved in our Women's Retreat at Linda Jarvis's house, Saturday, February 7, 2009. It was wonderful to hear the word our beloved Lord brought forth through the glory of Holy Spirit and delivered by His precious, servant Filese Hauser! On the way home, our car was loaded with five women, all happily buzzing about our day!



The lessons about the Word imparted Saturday actually started on Friday for me. I have a mentally disabled brother who is looking for a new group home. Friday, my husband and I took my brother to three homes to look over for possible placement. In the first two homes there was so much demonic spiritual activity, I couldn't hold back the tears as I walked through them, thinking about the precious people left there. That night as I slept I was attacked with a severe case of vertigo. Any slight movement sent my equilibrium reeling and spinning. My husband and I prayed through the early morning hours, recognizing that this attack was a result of a place we had visited earlier in the day. By morning I was too dizzy to stand. I was sure God had something special to share at the women's retreat. So, I stood up and declared Isaiah 53:5, I was healed; vertigo had to go and prepared for the retreat. By the time I arrived at the retreat all vertigo was gone. Praise the Lord!

The Lord gave us an important "key". He said, I have given you the keys of the kingdom and our key ring expanded! Filese released the word given to SGMM and their partners for 2009. The Holy Spirit was so gracious to us in revealing the differences in binding and loosing and, locking and unlocking. Particularly in the zones we have been given dominion over and the ones we are moving through. While to varying degrees I have practiced this through the years, I realized all over again the extreme importance of this through Friday's experience. I realized through the zones I had traveled into Friday, I had carried back spirits into my home. While I will admit I am quite diligent about unseen germs and the importance of washing my hands often, regrettably, I find I have been less concerned and as diligent about unseen spirits! Everywhere we go we see reminders to wash (the unseen germs from) our hands. But, how many reminders do we see to wash ourselves, our spirits, and our zone from unseen spirits in the places we have traveled through? This was a mighty revelation from the Holy Spirit. Life changing!!!

After the retreat many ladies commented they could have spent the whole day learning more in this area. How about it Filese? While we still know the weapons of warfare we have used in the past still work, The Holy Spirit is revealing new weapons and new strategies which are unique and highly effective for our current time. The weapons of the United States military have changed drastically in the last 100, 50, 10, even the last 5 years. This is what keeps America ahead of our enemies. Why wouldn't God's strategies change too? Praise God to the highest for delivering this important key to those of us who attended Saturday.

Before I close, I just want to say to all those who have partnered with SGMM. This was my first time to attend an SGMM event. I want to thank you for all you have sown into this wonderful ministry through, prayer, time and gifts of giving! You made Saturday possible for fourteen grateful women of God. I am consumed with the Spirit of the Lord that met us that day. I am consumed with eternal thankfulness for your support, as well! Thank you!
